

Guidelines for Reception of Communion



1.	How would you describe the call of God? Do you believe that God has called you to service in this world?
2.	Why did Elijah go to find Elisha? What does that say about God's concern to provide a voice in this world? How does God provide today? Who are his prophets today?
3.	Why did Elijah throw his cloak on Elisha? What does that symbolize? How does God clothe his people today? Is that clothing for every Christian or a select few? If for everyone, how does that effect God's calling on us?
4.	How would you describe Elisha's economic situation? Is he from a wealthy, prominent family? Do you think that is important to the story? Is it surprising?
5.	Why does Elisha want to go back to his family? What do you make of Elijah's response?

Banners Explained: The change of colors for Lent and the following Sundays helps communicate the movement of sacred time as well as our journeys. The color purple is a visual reminder of our need for repentance and self-examination.

On the banner to the right is an acanthus. It is the leaf that you see all over classic Greek and Roman architecture. It is a thorny plant, and a few have speculated that it may have been the source of the crown of thorns. Within Christianity, the thorns are a symbol of pain, and of sin and its punishment. It was regarded in ancient times by pagans as a symbol of death and rebirth.

On the other is a thistle. The thistle is a symbol of temporal sorrow and the curse of sin from the story of the Fall. Because the thistle is a thorny bush, it also is often portrayed as the source of Christ's crown of thorns. Because thistles flourish to crowd out useful crops, they have also been used to represent the "tares" or weeds written of in Matthew 13.
