- 1. Who did the prophet's widow turn to for help? When you face a crisis, who do you turn to?
- 2. What do you do when you feel overwhelmed? Do you reach out, or do you withdraw?
- 3. Do you see God's strength in your own weakness? In what ways?
- 4. Through the miracle of the oil, God multiplied what he had already given. Have you experienced this in your life? How has God provided for you beyond what you would may have expected or imagined?
- 5. What do people owe you? How does God's mercy make you more generous or forgiving? In what ways?
- 6. Elisha told the widow to ask for jars from all of her neighbors, not just a few. What does this say about the importance of community? What does it say about faith? What does it say about prayer? How might this story change the way we pray?

Banners Explained: The change of colors for Lent and the following Sundays helps communicate the movement of sacred time as well as our journeys. The color purple is a visual reminder of our need for repentance and self-examination.

On the banner to the right is an acanthus. It is the leaf that you see all over classic Greek and Roman architecture. It is a thorny plant, and a few have speculated that it may have been the source of the crown of thorns. Within Christianity, the thorns are a symbol of pain, and of sin and its punishment. It was regarded in ancient times by pagans as a symbol of death and rebirth. On the other is a thistle. The thistle is a symbol of temporal sorrow and the curse of sin from the story of the Fall. Because the thistle is a thorny bush, it also is often portrayed as the source of Christ's crown of thorns. Because thistles flourish to crowd out useful crops, they have also been used to represent the "tares" or weeds written of in Matthew 13.
