

Scripture Reading 2 Kings 4:38-44

Elisha returned to Gilgal and there was a famine in that region. While the company of the prophets was meeting with him, he said to his servant, "Put on the large pot and cook some stew for these prophets."

- 39 One of them went out into the fields to gather herbs and found a wild vine and picked as many of its gourds as his garment could hold. When he returned, he cut them up into the pot of stew, though no one knew what they were. 40 The stew was poured out for the men, but as they began to eat it, they cried out, "Man of God, there is death in the pot!" And they could not eat it.
- 41 Elisha said, "Get some flour." He put it into the pot and said, "Serve it to the people to eat." And there was nothing harmful in the pot.
- 42 A man came from Baal Shalishah, bringing the man of God twenty loaves of barley bread baked from the first ripe grain, along with some heads of new grain. "Give it to the people to eat," Elisha said.
- 43 "How can I set this before a hundred men?" his servant asked.

But Elisha answered, "Give it to the people to eat. For this is what the Lord says: 'They will eat and have some left over.'" 44 Then he set it before them, and they are and had some left over, according to the word of the Lord.

COMMUNION

Guidelines for Reception of Communion

Communion is a family meal for Christians. We hope that this time is helpful as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ, and with his people, the church.

The Great Thanksgiving

Minister: Therefore, lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord!

Minister: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.

People: It is right to give him thanks and praise!



Sermon Notes

2 Kings 4:38-44 GOD'S UNEXPECTED GRACE IN THE FAMINE THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO THE PROPHETS

_____Community Group Questions_____

1.	Why is it significant that a famine is going on? What is the likely reason there is a famine? How does Amos 8:11 fit into our understanding of this famine?
2.	Who are the beneficiaries of these miracles? Why does it matter that these prophets not die?
3.	Upon first glance, these miracles seem insignificant and trivial. But are they? Why not? Discuss.
4.	When God wants to do something tremendous and earth-changing, does he go with loud, drastic, fireworks? Or does he start with the small, seemingly insignificant, mustard seeds? What does this mean for the neglected, unwanted, insignificant?
5.	How does Elisha's feeding of the 100 prophets foreshadow Jesus feeding the 5000?
6.	We often feel like God doesn't care about us, or that what we do doesn't matter. How does this passage reject that notion and encourage and strengthen you because you have a God that cares about the minutiae and the mundane?
7.	This passage teaches us and demonstrates that Yahweh is a God that keeps His promises. Does your life demonstrate that you believe this? Why? Why not? What might your life look like if you did believe that? What might you give up because it's true? What might you start doing because it's true? Where would freedom reign in your life? Where would God's mission for His world take precedence in your life?

Paul's Letter to the Romans is often thought to be the heart of the Bible because it explains the doctrines of the Christian faith, such as how Jesus' death on the cross satisfied God's wrath against our sin, and how His righteousness covers us through faith. Banners Explained: Easter Sunday begins a fifty-day season of renewal known as Eastertide. This season is marked by white banners that will hang in the sanctuary until the Day of Pentecost.

The banner on the left is a reproduction of one found in ancient catacombs. The white background represents newness, freshness, and purity; the red of the cross symbolizes the work that Jesus did on our behalf. It is complemented with the first and last letters of the Greek name for Jesus (IC), the first and last letters of the Greek word for Christ (XC), and the Greek word for Conqueror (NIKA). The short bars above the letters indicate that they are abbreviations.

On the right, the circle of the Celtic Cross is a symbol of eternity as well but emphasizing the endlessness of God's love as shown through Christ's sacrifice on the cross.
