COMMUNION

Guidelines for Reception of Communion

Communion is a family meal for Christians. We welcome all committed followers of Jesus Christ to partake of this sacrament: those who are baptized members of a congregation which proclaims the gospel, who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer using the prayers that follow as guidelines. We hope that this time is helpful as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ, and with his people, the church.

Confession of Sin

*Minister &
People:*

Father, we come to you this morning as people who need to be redeemed. We need to be made whole. We confess that we need You to heal us for we cannot heal ourselves.

We confess our wandering hearts. We run after acceptance, prestige, wealth, order, pleasure and novelty in a desperate effort to heal our hearts. None of these can redeem us, none of these can make us whole. Yet we are slow to learn. Forgive us we pray.

We confess our faithless hearts. We have looked for redemption everywhere but in your arms. We haven't looked there because we doubt your love for us. Forgive us we pray.

Now, Father, accept our confession and receive us gladly. We ask this not upon our deserving it, or even the honesty of our confession, but for the sake of Jesus. You rejected Him, the innocent, in order to embrace us, the guilty.

Community Group Questions

1. What are some of the major events going on in the world? How do your challenges compare to those issues? How difficult is it to believe that God is concerned with our lives?
2. How does this story and its place in 2 Kings address my personal issues?
3. What is the issue in this story? Why is the missing ax head a crisis? What would happen to the person who lost this borrowed equipment?
4. Do we think that we have the same issues? What are we enslaved to? Do we really believe that we are enslaved? What has to happen if we are to be freed from our enslavement? Who is the Prophet who must come and set us free?
5. How does God provide a reversal in the story? How often does iron float? What does that say about the unlikely or hopeless situations in our lives?
6. What does this mean for you? What would it mean for you to be free from the expectations and standards of others?
7. If you knew this freedom, how would that change the way you deal with others? Do others feel released and free by you, or do they feel an increased burden?
8. What would it mean for you to be driven to set people free? Are you driven to do for others what has been done for you?

Banners Explained: Easter Sunday begins a fifty-day season of renewal known as Eastertide. This season is marked by white banners that will hang in the sanctuary until the Day of Pentecost.

The banner on the left is a reproduction of one found in ancient catacombs. The white background represents newness, freshness, and purity; the red of the cross symbolizes the work that Jesus did on our behalf. It is complemented with the first and last letters of the Greek name for Jesus (IC), the first and last letters of the Greek word for Christ (XC), and the Greek word for Conqueror (NIKA). The short bars above the letters indicate that they are abbreviations.

On the right, the circle of the Celtic Cross is a symbol of eternity as well but emphasizing the endlessness of God's love as shown through Christ's sacrifice on the cross.
