In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. ## Community Group Questions

1. What are the broken ways you tend to react with when life gets hard due to suffering, persecution, temptation, weakness, discouragement and doubt? Is prayer hard, impossible even, during these times? Why/why not?
2. How is it encouraging and empowering to you knowing that the Spirit himself intercedes for us when we don't know what to pray for?
3. What would it look like in your life if you truly believed that you cannot ruin God's purposes for us?
4. Do you really believe that God works "all things" for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose? How does this verse get misused and abused?
5. Is there a way you are looking to change your circumstances, instead of seeking to let the Holy Spirit change your heart's attitude toward them? Discuss.
6. How does vs. 30 encourage you today?
7. How do you need the truth - that nothing can separate God's love from his people - to comfort you today?
8. What are the things we allow ourselves to falsely think will separate us from God's love? When are you most susceptible to believe these things?
9. How would you live if vs. 31-39 rang in your head all day long? What might your life, relationships, service, holiness, relationship with God, etc...look like? Preach these verses to yourself all day every day!

**Banners Explained:** In Christian tradition, green came to symbolize the life of the church following Pentecost, as well as symbolizing the hope of new life in the resurrection. This color indicates ordinary time, which is the time between the major Christian Seasons.

The Banner on right symbolizes the Trinity, the belief that God is three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and yet, one God. No part of the Trinity is ever out of alignment (moving independently) from the other parts of the Trinity. The circle represents eternity. The circle is frequently seen with the Trinitarian symbol, representing the eternal qualities of each part of the Godhead.

On the left, the circle of the Celtic Cross is a symbol of eternity as well but emphasizing the endlessness of God's love as shown through Christ's sacrifice on the cross. The IHS in the center is the abbreviated name of Jesus in the greek and is a very old symbol, dating back to the first century. Each panels focuses on a central aspect of His work. The cross is framed with grapes, a symbol of our Lord's blood shed on the cross for us.
