Community Group Questions

1. How do God's mercies, from 12:1, impact Paul's call to love and the marks of the transformed Christian life in vs. 9-21? Why can't we separate God's mercy/mercies from the imperatives of vs. 9-21?
2. How have you struggled with hypocritical/insincere love in your life? Where/how has it manifested itself? What is the answer to actually living with sincere love?
3. How do we misapply, misinterpret, and misuse hating what is evil/clinging to what is good from what Paul and the gospel mean for us with those imperatives? What are ways we need to repent and properly follow these calls on our lives?
4. Is it hypocritical to love someone you don't like? Why? Why not? What is the gospel answer to loving someone that is difficult to love or unlovely?
5. What are the situations and who are the people you fail to honor above yourself? Why? How does the gospel reshape the way you see yourself and those around you?
6. Think of a fellow brother or sister in Christ who is in need. How can you do for them whatever it takes this week?
7. What wrong responses are you tempted to when someone wrongs you or does evil/harm to you?
8. How is vs. 9 a boundary against misinterpreting vs. 10-21?
9. What would it look like practically for you to overcome evil with good in a specific situation?
10. Do you need to pursue counseling for how to deal with a wrong that has been done to you?

Banners Explained: The change of colors for Lent and the following Sundays helps communicate the movement of sacred time as well as our journeys. The color purple is a visual reminder of our need for repentance and self-examination.

On the banner to the right is an acanthus. It is the leaf that you see all over classic Greek and Roman architecture. It is a thorny plant, and a few have speculated that it may have been the source of the crown of thorns. Within Christianity, the thorns are a symbol of pain, and of sin and its punishment. It was regarded in ancient times by pagans as a symbol of death and rebirth.

On the other is a thistle. The thistle is a symbol of temporal sorrow and the curse of sin from the story of the Fall. Because the thistle is a thorny bush, it also is often portrayed as the source of Christ's crown of thorns. Because thistles flourish to crowd out useful crops, they have also been used to represent the "tares" or weeds written of in Matthew 13.
