

1. How do you normally respond when you encounter lists of names? Skip? Plow through? Gloss over? 2. Is this section just a list of names for Paul? What is he communicating to them and to us? What is his relationship to the names? 3. Would we make anyone's list? Why or why not? Who are the people that you are thankful that God brought into your life? Have you told them? 4. How diverse is the list? In what ways does this list subvert the cultural norms? How many women can you find on the list? Why is that unusual? Is it surprising that there are at least two non-Christians on the list? 5. What gifts do you possess? Do you see yourself as crucial to the expansion of the Kingdom in this community? Why or why not? Do you see those around you as crucial or dispensable? 6. What are some of the ways that we fail to appreciate and cultivate diversity? How does that lack of diversity weaken us? 7. What does Paul mean by using the word establish? How is one established in a world of uncertainty and change? What does it mean when we say that Jesus is the gospel? 8. What are the ways that we try to change other than the gospel? Why are those methods futile? 9. How can we better encourage one another with the gospel?

Banners Explained: Easter Sunday begins a fifty-day season of renewal known as Eastertide. This season is marked by white banners that will hang in the sanctuary until the Day of Pentecost.

The banner on the left is a reproduction of one found in ancient catacombs. The white background represents newness, freshness, and purity; the red of the cross symbolizes the work that Jesus did on our behalf. It is complemented with the first and last letters of the Greek name for Jesus (IC), the first and last letters of the Greek word for Christ (XC), and the Greek word for Conqueror (NIKA). The short bars above the letters indicate that they are abbreviations.

On the right, the circle of the Celtic Cross is a symbol of eternity as well but emphasizing the endlessness of God's love as shown through Christ's sacrifice on the cross.
